We also acknowledge most gratefully, the essential financial support we receive from our partnership links and from personal donations. A number of longer term grants came to an end in 2013 at a time when the demand for our input continued to grow through the positive appreciation of our work. These services mean that we are able to make significant differences to individuals, families and schools. However, without additional funding we will be unable to service these increasing needs. As a result the Trustees have set a target to raise an additional £200,000 over the next two years.

Project Reports

Bridge Builders Christian Trust is a small local charity working quietly but effectively at the heart of communities in Stevenage & the surrounding area.

ExploRE



Throughout the year Bridge Builders Christian Trust has worked in partnership with local churches and Christian volunteers to resource and deliver RE syllabus related assemblies in, original, exciting and thought provoking ways, in 9 local primary schools on a regular basis and as requested in other schools throughout the town.

Church visits, Religious Education lessons and teacher resources for the delivery of RE lessons have also been offered and enthusiastically received by several schools in Stevenage. The ExploRE Team's desire is that children not only learn about the Christian Faith but have the opportunity to explore its relevance for Christians and themselves today. The Easter Journey and The Christmas Journey Projects are another excellent example of how we fulfil this aim.



The Easter Journey, for Year 6 children, was hosted by 8 churches and attended by 1000+ pupils from 26 primary schools in Stevenage and the surrounding areas; including Cambridge. Over 100 trained volunteers made up the ExploRE Team and were vital to the success of this event. Every child heard the

account of key characters within the events of Holy Week and Easter and were encouraged to ask questions about the significance of those experiences for each character, as well as consider how those experiences might influence their own lives and the lives of believers today.




The Christmas Journey, for Year 2 children, was run for a second year. 600 children from 15 schools attended as the ExploRE Team successfully worked in partnership with 2 local churches and 70 trained volunteers. The Bridge Builders administration team built an on-line booking system which further

enhanced the smooth running of this project and £900 funding from SACRE for costumes ensured that the children were treated to a visually exciting experience which enabled them to not only hear the Christmas story but also begin to engage with it and understand some of the significance it has for Christians and themselves today.



Mentoring & Pastoral Support (MAPS)

During term time we are privileged to mentor (one to one and in small groups), a number of primary school aged children for whom life is proving pretty tough. In 2012/13 Mentoring and Pastoral Support (MAPS)



was delivered in 6 local primary schools. The MAPS Project is specifically designed to help prevent personal, social and emotional issues from escalating into more dramatic incidents and gives children essential strategies to deal with their challenging lives.

A MAPS school is a school with whom Bridge Builders Christian Trust has established a working relationship over a number of years and where the staff have sufficient confidence in the team to entrust them with the pastoral care of those who they recognise as being vulnerable and in need of early preventative measures.

At any one time the team may be working with around 30 children who have been referred to the Trust. This year 43 children have received one to one support. Programmes of small group and whole class activities have also been delivered covering such issues as the raising of self-esteem, improvement of social skills, formation of lasting relationships and transition.

Schools outreach in the St Nicholas area of Stevenage continued to grow. Our well established MAPS work in Trotts Hill and Giles Junior School has built up a trust amongst staff which has enabled the team to engage with both schools at many other levels. They have undertaken a highly valued pastoral role while being well placed to provide assistance with the RE curriculum. The primary school in the neighbouring parish of Graveley has also welcomed support.

Whale Tales



Allied to our Mentoring and Pastoral Support work we have continued to offer our Protective Behaviours training day for KS2 in our local schools. This is a fun packed day, where through story-telling, theatre, puppets, parachute games and discussion group activities we share the story of Jonah (and the big fish) to hang the Protective

Behaviours themes that make up the Citizenship part of the National Curriculum.

This is one of our professional services to which schools readily contribute. We shared with five schools during this year; it is a programme we enjoy delivering & schools book us year on year. We again are restricted by the number we can put on during the year as it requires many volunteers both in preparation and delivery. A really huge thank you goes out to them from us at Bridge Builders!



Launchpad



A project jointly staffed by members of Bridge Builders and St Hugh & St John's Church in the Chells area of Stevenage providing a range of class based projects

& two midweek clubs.

Regular assemblies, also delivered by the team, helped reinforce these themes. Each week the two after school clubs were attended by a total of approximately 50 youngsters. Another club was set up in September 2012 at St Peters Church, Broadwater with an average of 10 children attending each week.

We also took 40 youngsters away for a weekend residential to explore 'Easter and beyond - with Peter'.



Kind Hands



A resource we offer to Reception age children. We explore stories in the Bible that reinforce the use of our hands in a positive way. In small groups we then backup our teaching with a fun activity or craft. To finish we sing an interactive song together as a whole class.

The Bridge Builders Resource Centre

The centre based at St Paul's Methodist Church, Stevenage, continues to provide the administrative hub for all our school's outreach projects. It is the meeting place for our paid staff and volunteers. It is also our training base and home for our resources which are available for use by a wide variety of partner organisations.

The Church & Community Fund is funding the Resource Centre Manager for 3 years. This post is also supported by the Albans Diocese Mission Support Fund and Hertfordshire County Council SACRE grant. The Resource Centre also received funding from The Belling Trust to support its IT rebuild.



Toddlerrific



We continued to provide a popular meeting place at the heart of the Broadwater community.

Each Monday morning parents, carers and their under 5's were welcomed into the Resource Centre and encouraged to take part in a wide range of activities. Approximately 20 families attended each week. We worked in close partnership with staff from The Broadwater Children's Centre who provided a play worker to support the team. Sadly this group closed at end of July 2013.
